Discussion

1. Welcome and Thanks

- The Chair thanked **Teignmouth RFC** for hosting the South Devon Clubs *Club Voice* meeting.

2. RFU Strategic Themes

The Chair outlined the RFU's four priority themes and explained that responsibility for delivery has been devolved to the County RFU:

1. More players in the game
2. Keeping players in the game
3. Developing a clubhouse offer
4. Game management

3. Devon Hardship Fund

- Fund available for age-grade players, supporting:
 - Kit
 - Membership fees
 - Festivals

- Other essential participation costs

4. Player Transition: Colts to Senior Rugby

- Aims to create more transition opportunities. (Note, Post meeting: There are 6105 players in Devon aged 18 to 23 years old)
- Recent successes noted:
 - 7s tournament at Brixham
 - Upcoming 10s tournament at Tavistock
- Clubs are encouraged to propose additional initiatives to support retention at this stage; Devon is willing to support these ideas.

5. Retention & Extended Participation

- Desire to keep players engaged longer.
- Devon is willing to support Walking Rugby tournaments if clubs wish to develop them.

6. Devon Cup Competitions

Discussion points:

- Several fixtures did not take place due to teams being unable to raise a side.

Potential solutions:

- Ensure cup dates are released at the same time as league fixtures; August release was seen as being too late.
- Consider returning to semi-finals based on final league positions, though this may clash with an already crowded late-season schedule:
 - League Play-offs
 - National cup competitions
 - Representative rugby
- Suggestion that the Junior Cup becomes an under-23 transition competition (similar to the Prem Cup).
- Proposal to survey players for their views on cup competitions.

7. Governance

7.1 RugbySafe

- No RFU First Aid courses currently available; individuals will need to self-certify.

- Five club audits completed; actions agreed where required.

7.2 Safeguarding

- Most safeguarding issues raised this year have been referred to Discipline.

7.3 Discipline

- Adult discipline levels are broadly similar to previous years.
- Growing concerns about behaviour at age-grade level, particularly from parents/carers and some coaches.
- RFU TREDs values were reiterated.
- Strict reminder: No one may enter the field of play without explicit permission from the Referee.
- Several individuals have received Interim Suspension Orders (ISOs) for unauthorised pitch entry.

7.4 Playing Up/Playing Down

- Governance will continue to manage these requests.
- Clubs must have approvals before a player participates up or down.
- Assessment must cover club suitability and player suitability.

7.5 Other Governance Issues

- Can clubs check GMS roles and contacts are up-to-date?
- Post Meeting: Club Howdens Risk Assessment to be completed on GMS

8. Fixtures – Girls' Rugby

- League and cup fixtures for U14, U16, and U18 girls are now in place.

9. Representative Rugby

9.1 Under 18s Boys

- Squad selected by TM Mark Long and Coach Ricky Bentham.
- Players selected from 18 different clubs.

9.2 Under 18s Girls

- Assessment completed this weekend.

9.3 Under 20s and Seniors

- Men's and women's teams awaiting confirmation of competition structure for the County Championship.
- Senior men will play a warm-up match vs. the Navy.

9.4 Tamar Cup

- Senior men's Tamar Cup likely to take place around Easter weekend, following last year's success. This season the game will be in Devon.
- Senior women's participation dependent on the County Championship draw.

9.5 Deaf Rugby

- Devon Deaf team scheduled to play Wales Deaf.

9.6 Tamar Shield

- New competition for Counties 8 and 9 players, to take place in Cornwall (date TBC).

10. Development

- Planning underway for this year's Coaching Conference, supported by Joel.
- Funding available for club facilities development.

11. Volunteering

- A volunteer celebration event will be arranged later in the year.
- Two opportunities for women volunteers to watch the Red Roses, either in a match or a training session.

12. Regulation 15 Review

- Nicola encouraged all clubs to complete the Age-Grade Regulation 15 Review.
